Message from School (Rhonda & Keri)

Had our Winter Concert in December, was a huge success. Standing room only. Special thank you to the music teacher Miss Dickson. This week we have hoop dancing with Elder Shirley, has been going really well. Have been doing hoop dancing, circle dancing and sharing lessons from her culture. Thank you to school council for paying for that residency.

Recorders to be purchased this week, recorder unit will begin in February and a second unit in May. Sound system update: had someone to come in to look at the current system, it's old and the bandwidth is fighting with cell phones so when the gym is full we get that interference — can't use wireless or Bluetooth with it. Will be looking at replacing unit. Also using a lot of mentor text at school — find books with important themes, use those to teach. Looking to purchase more of these books as well.

Clay for kids: Other residency we are hoping to have this year in February. Each class would choose a project to do, can connect it to their curriculum. Each student will make one piece and then paint it, Clay for Kids will fire and glaze them.

7. Financial Update

- Currently: \$12,245.65 in council account
- Purdy's and Skip the Depot should add another \$2,000
- Not too much to go out: Patroller and Grade 6 grad
- Rhonda: school asks:
 - o Dinner for teachers at last learning conferences \$400; all in favour
 - o Books for kids from Scholastic (one kid per classroom) \$400; all in favour
 - Sound system: waiting for a quote but expect it will be around \$8,000 (mics and receivers would be around \$3-4,000). Could do a split with the school on cost.
 (cannot use casino account). Rhonda will bring quote back to Council but we could probably contribute up to \$5,000 will vote when quote is back.
